# 🖖 Global Stage in Brazil/in Hawaii – Learning from Our Trailblazing Ancestors ¥

This year we began 'Global Stage'. In addition to raising interest in Japan/Fukuoka amongst Overseas Fukuoka Kenjinkai youth,

the program also aims to provide an opportunity for young people from the prefecture to set their sights abroad through exchange with local youth during visits to Overseas Kenjinkai. For this first time, two groups of 5 participants each were sent to the Brazil Fukuoka Kenjinkai and Hawaii Shima Fukuoka Kenjinkai. The participants were able to deepen their knowledge and understanding of Kenjinkai and immigrants by visiting businesses and government offices, learning about the local histories of migration, experiencing homestay and interacting with local youth. From here on, we hope these youth will become a bridge between Fukuoka Prefecture and the Overseas Kenjinkai, and cooperate actively in future exchange projects.
