Information about Exchange Projects between the Fukuoka International Exchange Foundation and Overseas Fukuoka Kenjinkai

The Visiting Group for the Promotion of Friendship between Fukuoka Prefecture and the State of Hawaii visited Hawaii, meeting with the Hawaii-Fukuoka Kenjinkai and deepening their bonds of friendship.



On the 22nd April 2023, an Exchange of Opinions Meeting was held in Honolulu, Hawaii, with the Hawaii-Fukuoka Kenjinkai. From Fukuoka Prefecture, Governor Hattori and Legislative Assembly Chair Representative Kabashima, as well as other members of the Visiting Group for the Promotion of Friendship between Fukuoka Prefecture and the State of Hawaii were in attendance.
