Passing away of Hiroshi Ogawa, former Governor of Fukuoka Prefecture

Former Fukuoka Prefecture Governor Hiroshi Ogawa passed away on the morning of November 2nd. He resigned from the governorship in March this year in the middle of his third term in order to concentrate on the treatment of lung adenocarcinoma. We would like to express our deepest condolences. Utilizing the Kenjinkai Network: "Youth Seminar by Fukuoka Prefecture Residents Active Overseas"

Utilizing the network of Overseas Fukuoka Kenjinkai and other Fukuoka Kenjinkai members, an online seminar was held for young people aiming to be active overseas, inviting members of the Kenjinkai who are active overseas as lecturers.

On Monday, November 1, we invited Ren Yano, a member of the Fukuoka Kenjinkai in Sydney, as a lecturer and held an online seminar titled "Thinking about your future from the perspective of the 'place'" for 254 first-year students of Seiho High School, his alma mater in Buzen City, along with 20 teachers and others. The seminar was held online from Sydney. The students, who had never been interested in foreign countries before, felt more interested with foreign countries after listening to Mr. Yano's talk.

On Saturday, November 27, we invited Masaharu Koga, a member of the Delhi Fukuoka Kenjinkai, as a lecturer and held an online seminar from India titled "Living Abroad: What Makes You Valuable" for the general public including students and working adults who applied in advance. Comments included that it was a valuable opportunity to hear directly from the participants about their experiences and attitudes overseas, and that the words "the value lies in the fact that you are different from others" left a deep impression on them.

On Thursday, December 9, we again invited Mr. Koga as a lecturer and held an online seminar for about 120 first, second, and third-year students of the International Culture Course at Genkai Prefectural High School in Koga City. In the acknowledgments on behalf of the students, he said, "It was very informative because there are many students who want to be active in the world in the future. We, too, would like to do our best to enhance our own value and lead a life where we can demonstrate it.

On Sunday, January 23, Yasushi Odahara, a member of the Fukuoka Kenjinkai in Thailand, will give an online lecture from Thailand to the general public on the theme of "Becoming a person who can play an active role in the global community: How I, a high school student in Fukuoka, started a business supporting Japanese people in Thailand.
